Dear FSS participants,


We all know someone who has been affected by bed bugs in their home, or have heard horror stories of travelers encountering bed bugs on their trip. Bed bugs can infest any location, *clean or dirty*, during any season. So there is no better day than today to protect you and your family from those pesky little bugs!

Bed bugs are small, brown, oval shaped insects about the size of an apple seed. Bed bugs attach themselves to luggage, clothes, and used beds and couches (from homes & curbs). Once bed bugs are in your home they can spread into other rooms. If you live in an apartment building they can even spread to your neighbors!

If you suspect bed bugs in your home act immediately.

Steps you can take to remove bed bugs are:

- -Wash all bedding and clothing in hot water and dry on the highest heat setting.
- -Put anything that cannot be washed in the dryer on the highest heat possible for 30 minutes.
- -Vacuum frequently (remove and seal the bag, then place outside).
- -Place bed bug protectors on mattresses and pillows.
- -Remove clutter from around your bed.
- -If infestation persists, a professional exterminator may be necessary.





JOB SUMMARY:

The Outreach Coordinator will develop the community's awareness of hunger by engaging the community in volunteering, fundraising and overall strategic direction of the pantry. The objective of this role is to help grow the Oshkosh Area Community Pantry through networking and collaborating with others in the community.

ESSENTIAL DUTIES AND RESPONSIBILITIES:

These duties are not meant to be all-inclusive and other duties may be assigned.

- Oversee orders for pantry supplies.
- Maintain various forms of documentation such as historical documents and legal documents.
- Create and manage the volunteer program.
- · Recruit volunteers and review, accept, or decline volunteer applications.
- · Supervise and train volunteers
- Determine and launch new volunteers per pantry needs.
- · Asist in the development of direct mail fundraising campaigns.
- Lead the coordination of printed materials and mail lists.
- Develop and implement a social media campaign: Twitter, Website, Facebook, Newsletter.

MINIMUM QUALIFICATIONS:

- Bachelor's degree in social services or combined work experience.
- Three (3) or more years of experience in the field or in a related area.
- · Detailed orientated.
- Strong verbal and written communications skills.
- Proficiency with various web-based software applications including Microsoft Office Word, Excel, PowerPoint, SharePoint, etc.
- Valid Driver's License.
- Ability to travel 10%.

PREFERRED QUALIFICATIONS:

- Experience training volunteers.
- Public speaking.
