**Nurse's Notes** 

Follow these tips to stay safe during extreme heat:



- When possible, stay in air conditioning on hot days. If you don't have air conditioning, head to libraries, malls, and other public spaces to keep cool.
- Be sure to check on older friends and neighbors who live alone.
- If you have to be outside, stick to the cooler morning and evening hours. Wear light, loose clothing and take frequent, air conditioned breaks.
- Beware of hot cars. Never leave a person or a pet in a parked car, even for a short time. On an 80 degree day, the temperature inside a car can reach 100 degrees in less than 10 minutes.
- Stay hydrated. Don't wait to feel thirsty. Drink plenty of water throughout the day. Avoid alcohol and hot, heavy meals.
- Taking a cool shower or bath will cool you down OR apply cold wet washcloths to the neck, head and arms or legs also cools the body quickly.
- Stay informed. Watch your local weather forecasts so you can plan outdoor activities safely. Pay attention to any extreme heat alerts.
- Keep your pets cool. Be sure to give your pets plenty of fresh, clean water. Make sure they have a shady place to get out of the sun, or keep them indoors.
- If you start feeling overheated, weak, dizzy, nauseated, or have muscle cramps, you could be experiencing heat illness. Move to air conditioning, drink water, get under a fan, and put cool washcloths on your neck or forehead.
- If your symptoms worsen or don't improve, go to the emergency room or call 911.

#### **Manager's Corner**

#### WHEDA Inspection

Wisconsin Housing and Economic Development Authority (WHEDA)--will be conducting their management review and inspection on July 16 and 18, 2018 between 8:00am-5:00pm on both days. The purpose of WHEDA's review is to make certain the Oshkosh/Winnebago County Housing Authority is in compliance with all HUD and WHEDA standards of operation.

On the above-referenced dates, random units at Court Tower Apartments, both occupied and unoccupied, will be entered by our WHEDA representative, along with your Property Manager, Bob Poeschl. Your cooperation with this inspection is required. If your unit is selected for inspection, and you are not at home, a Notice of Entry will be left.

Please report if there is maintenance work that may need to be done.

#### Shopping carts

Please return shopping carts promptly when you are finished with them. They are not meant to be kept in apartments. They are meant to assist residents with items like groceries from their vehicle to their apartments. Please return carts when you are finished with them.

#### Visitation Policy

I wanted to provide clarification on the Housing Authority's visitation policy. Every tenant's lease states the following clause, "Guests or visitors of the Resident may stay for only fourteen (14) consecutive days or a total of 30 days in a 12 month period." Simply put, you can have guests for a total 30 days in a 12 month period but once that guest stays for 14 consecutive days you only have 16 non consecutive days left that the guest can stay over. The 12 month period begins when the guest is reported or determined to be there by the HA. If you have any questions on this policy, feel to make an appointment with me.

- 2 fully cooked brats (casings removed)
- 2 3 teaspoons caraway seeds
- 112 oz. can or bottle of beer
