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Youth Mental Health First Aid is designed to teach parents, family members, caregivers, teachers, school staff, peers, neighbors, health and human services workers, and other caring citizens to help an adolescent (age 12-18) who is experiencing a mental health or addictions challenge or is in crisis.


Youth Mental Health First Aid is primarily designed for adults who regularly interact with young people. The course introduces common mental health challenges for youth, reviews typical adolescent development, and teaches a 5-step action plan for how to help young people in both crisis and non-crisis situations. Topics covered include anxiety, depression, substance use, disorders in which psychosis may occur, disruptive behavior disorders (including AD/HD), and eating disorders.

- Submit the pre-application (in-person or by mail: pre-applications must be post marked no later than the last day of open period)
- Include a \$25 pre-application fee made payable to "Habitat" (personal check, money order, or cashier's check only – NO CASH)
- Applications submitted electronically or without pre-application fee will be considered incomplete.

We are hosting two informational sessions on our Welding Boot Camp for those interested in pursuing welding as a career. During the free session, college educators will cover topics like attendance expectations, equipment and materials, and an internship component. After 30 days in the program students begin working under a paid internship arrangement with an area employer. Upon completion of the program, students earn a welding certificate and an opportunity to work for a local company. Students without a high school diploma can also enroll.
