Tips for caring for others & ourselves during COVID-19



Listening

As we continue to manage the multiple stressors in our pandemic world, it is critical to prioritize active listening. Many people are experiencing unprecedented amounts of stress. Offering predictable and focused time to reflect and process is necessary for resilience.

HAVE YOU CONSIDERED..

- Protecting time on your calendar for open drop-in hours to talk about any topic, no agenda.
- Paying attention to changes in attendance and engagement in activities. If you notice a difference, reach out with compassion to check-in.
- Keeping local, accessible resources close at hand for those who are feeling the effects of prolonged stress.
- Being transparent about your self-care. By being honest about your limits you lead others to do the same.
- Recognizing that right now, emotions are unpredictable and rapidly changing, it's normal.



Young Women's Initiative: Starting Point 2.0

The Women's Fund is leading a project using a Two-Generation approach which will address the life-long economic security of single parent women and their children. This project creates a collaboration between FVTC's Starting Point Workshop and the college's educational resources combined with B.A.B.E.S. Inc. and their child development/parenting programming. By serving two-generations and creating a new stable environment for single-parent families, individuals struggling to survive will see the opportunities and potential that exist beyond their circumstances. This workshop and services provided are free to participants and children.



Participant Criteria:

- · 18-29 year old single parent woman
- · Income level must be at or below 200% of the Federal Poverty Guideline
- · Must have at least one child under the age of 11
- Must reside in one of the following counties: Calumet, Outagamie, Shawano, or Waupaca, and communities of Neenah & Menasha

Parent and any child under the age of 5 (not enrolled in school) will attend B.A.B.E.S. Inc., children under 11 will participate through take home activities. Emotional CPR



WHAT IS EMOTIONAL CPR?

Emotional CPR (eCPR) is a community education program that teaches people how to support another person experiencing emotional crisis. Just as Cardio-Pulmonary Resuscitation (CPR) teaches how to revive someone's physical heart, eCPR is designed to help us revive our emotional hearts in the midst of crisis, trauma and distress. Emotional CPR training was created by national leaders who saw a great need for ordinary people to be able to reach out and support each other and developed eCPR in response. Emotional CPR does not take the place of professional help; rather it recognizes and increases the capacity for natural, supportive relationships among people within their communities.

WHO IS IT FOR?

Emotional CPR training is for everyone. It provides people, with or without any previous training, a set of skills to assist another person who is experiencing emotional distress. People who use eCPR report that it becomes a way of life and strengthens their relationships with family, friends, coworkers, and community members.

WHY IS IT IMPORTANT?

Emotional CPR builds stronger communities. The eCPR training has broad application; it is used in culturally diverse communities, mobile crisis intervention, law enforcement, with families in crisis and in many community settings.

WI Rental Assistance Program



Wisconsinites should not fear being evicted or being without a place to live because their budgets have been impacted by the COVID-19 pandemic. And, that's why "We're All In."

Governor Tony Evers and the Wisconsin Department of Administration (DOA) are partnering with members of the Wisconsin Community Action Program Association (CAP) to assist renters when they need it most.

W.R.A.P. **WISCONSIN RENTAL ASSISTANCE PROGRAM**

In general, eligible applicants must be an adult Wisconsin resident with a household income at or below 80% of the county median income in the month of or prior to the application date.



Eligible costs include:

- Direct financial assistance for owed rent
- Security deposits



UP TO \$3.000

The Rental Assistance Program can award up to \$3,000 per household in a combination of rental payments and/or security deposits. The payment is paid directly to the landlord.

CAP Agencies will begin taking applications for W.R.A.P. on or before June 8th, 2020.

Not Feeling So Smart with Your Smart Phone?


