ELIGIBILITY



Meet all eligibility criteria for Wisconsin Works and have a job or job offer. They do not need to be enrolled but must be a Custodial Parent or a participating Non-Custodial Parent. JAL is provided through W-2.





- 1. Household income must be equal to or less than 150% of the Federal Poverty Level. WETAP is provided through a Mobility Manager.
- 2. Employed or have a job offer.

REPAYMENT







- The applicant completes a budget indicating his/her ability to repay the loan in cash within the agreed upon repayment timeframe. They agree to make regular monthly payments.
- 2. At least 25% of loan must be repaid in cash. The repayment plan may include in-kind community service.
- **3.** Initial repayment period is 12 months, but it may be extended with repayment renegotiation.





- 1. The applicant completes a budget worksheet to ensure they can pay back the required amount.
- 2. 75% of loan must be paid back in a 12 month term.

OASD Free Meals



The Oshkosh Area School District (OASD) will once again be offering nutritious meals to children during the summer months though its Summer Food Service Program. Free meals will be available at four District sites for children 18 years of age and under, and persons over 18 years of age who are determined by a state or local public educational agency to be mentally or physically disabled and who also participate in a public or private non-profit school program during the regular school year.

Young Women's Initiative:Starting Point 2.0

The Women's Fund is leading a project using a Two-Generation approach which will address the life-long economic security of single parent women and their children. This project creates a collaboration between FVTC's Starting Point Workshop and the college's educational resources combined with B.A.B.E.S. Inc. and their child development/parenting programming. By serving two-generations and creating a new stable environment for single-parent families, individuals struggling to survive will see the opportunities and potential that exist beyond their circumstances. This workshop and services provided are free to participants and children.



Participant Criteria:

- 18-35 year old single parent woman
- Income level must be at or below 200% of the Federal Poverty Guideline
- Must have at least one child under the age of 11
- Must reside in one of the following counties: Calumet, Outagamie, Shawano, or Waupaca, and communities of Neenah & Menasha

Project Details:

Parent and any child under the age of 5 will attend B.A.B.E.S. Inc. together. School age children under 11 will participate through take home activities. Wednesdays, September 15, 2021 through December 1, 2021 from 11:00 am to 2:00 pm. The last 4 weeks parents will transition to class at Fox Valley Technical College-Appleton Campus while the children remain at B.A.B.E.S. Inc.

Free Legal Tune Up

FREE Help for Wisconsinites with Common Legal Needs legaltuneup.org



Available in English and Spanish

Legal Tune Up will help Wisconsinites remove eligible past infractions from their online criminal records — with the goal of removing barriers for those seeking employment or housing.

Use Legal Tune Up to find out what legal problems you can fix without paying for a lawyer.

- Suspended driver's license
- Child Support
- Eviction Records
- Clearing Arrest Records
- And more...

To use the **Legal Tune Up** program, users enter their first name, last name and date of birth to allow it to scan public databases for criminal records, eviction records, suspended driver's licenses and child support orders.

If the tool finds records eligible for removal — including dismissed charges and arrest records when no charges were filed — it guides the user through the next steps in having them cleared. **Legal Tune Up** scans databases maintained by the state court system and by the state Department of Justice.

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Eviction Moratorium Extension

CDC Director Dr. Rochelle Walensky has signed an extension to the **eviction moratorium** further preventing the eviction of tenants who are unable to make rental payments. The moratorium that was scheduled to expire on June 30, 2021 is **now extended through July 31, 2021** and this is intended to be the **final extension** of the moratorium.

The COVID-19 pandemic has presented a historic threat to the nation's public health. Keeping people in their homes and out of crowded or congregate settings — like homeless shelters — by preventing evictions is a key step in helping to stop the spread of COVID-19.
