## Renters: What to do when the eviction moratorium ends

The federal eviction moratorium is ending on July 31 and any renters who are behind on payments could be in danger of losing their homes. There are steps you can take to try to prevent eviction.

Winnebago County is extended to October 3rd, 2021.

### Communicate with your landlord

Let your landlord know if you or anyone else in your household is still experiencing a loss of income. Remember—your landlord wants to avoid eviction as much as you do. Let your landlord know what steps you've taken to seek assistance and how much you're currently able to pay each month. In some cases, he/she may be willing to temporarily accept smaller payments if there's a plan for making them up in the future.

### Reach out for help

Temporary rent and utility assistance may be available based on your situation. For information on the Wisconsin Emergency Rental Assistance Program please see the following website: <https://doa.wi.gov/Pages/WERA.aspx>. At this site you can find out about what assistance is available, learn if you're eligible, and get directed to the application site that's specific to your county. After you've applied let your landlord know that you are trying to get help and keep him/her updated on the status.

### Take a Rent Smart course



Rent Smart is a free six-module course offered online by UW-Madison Division of Extension. Rent Smart focuses on the knowledge and skills essential for a successful renting experience. It helps participants to know and understand their

rights and responsibilities as a tenant, as well as know and understand the rights and responsibilities of their landlord. Emphasis is on forming a strong partnership between the tenant and landlord.

### Create and follow a spending plan

When times are tight it's important to prioritize your spending to ensure that expenses like housing, food, and utilities can be covered first. Make a list of all the money you have coming in and your monthly expenses. There are many budgeting tools available. [Here's one spending plan form](#) from UW-Madison Extension.

## **How do I qualify for the Lifeline Program?**

*Actual requirements vary by state, but in general to qualify for Lifeline, subscribers must either have an income that is at or below 135% of the federal Poverty Guidelines, or participate in one of the following assistance programs:*

- Medicaid
- Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP) Food Stamps
- Supplemental Security Income (SSI)
- Federal Public Housing Assistance (Section 8)
- Health Benefit Coverage under Child Health Plan (Federal CHIP)
- 135% of Federal Poverty Guidelines

## **What do I need to bring for the Lifeline Program?**

- Qualification proof of an above-mentioned program
- Approval Letter
- Statement of Benefits
- Proof of income if applying via Federal Poverty Guidelines
- Proof of identification
- Unexpired State or Federally issued ID
- Birth Certificate
- Social Security Card
- Proof of Address -
  - Unexpired State or Federally issued ID
  - Approval Letter for benefits
  - Mortgage statement or Lease (First page and signature page)
  - Addressed envelope with postage

## Home Fire Safety Checklist



### Cooking Safety

- "Keep an eye on what you fry." Stay in the kitchen when frying, grilling or using an open flame.



### Fireplaces, Space Heaters, Baseboards, etc.

- "3 feet from the heat." Furniture, curtains, dish towels and anything that could catch fire are at least 3 feet from any type of heat source.



### Smoking Safety

- Never smoke in bed.



### Electrical and Appliance Safety

- Large and small appliances are plugged directly into wall outlets.



### Children Playing

- Matches and lighters are locked away.



### Smoke Alarms

- Make sure you have working smoke alarms. Different types of smoke alarms, ionization and photoelectric, detect fire in different ways. Experts recommend having both types in your home.
- Change smoke alarm batteries every year unless it has a long-life battery.
- Replace smoke alarms every ten years.
- A combination of working smoke alarms and fire sprinklers decreases the risk of dying in a home fire.

## Home Fire Escape Plan

At least twice a year, use your home fire escape plan to practice your 2-minute drill with all your family members. Practice makes perfect! After each fire drill, mark down your escape time.

## \$100 COVID-19 VACCINE REWARD PROGRAM

GET A FREE VACCINE. GET \$100.  
STOP THE SPREAD.

COVID-19 vaccines are safe, effective and free. Everyone ages 12 and older is eligible. Find a vaccine near you by visiting, [vaccines.gov](https://www.vaccines.gov) or by calling 211 or 877-947-2211.

Get your first COVID-19 vaccine between August 20 to September 6. Get a \$100 Visa gift card.

### Who can get the vaccination reward?

Everyone who is eligible to receive the COVID-19 vaccine regardless of insurance, I.D., or citizenship. Just make sure you got your first COVID-19 vaccine from a Wisconsin vaccine provider within the period of August 20 through September 6.

### How do I get my vaccination reward?

- Get your COVID-19 vaccine.
- You will be asked to provide an email address and physical address. If you do not have one, please call 844-684-1064 and they will help you.
- And, register for your \$100 Visa gift card at [100.Wisconsin.gov](https://www.100.Wisconsin.gov) or by calling 844-684-1064.

## EMERGENCY BROADBAND BENEFIT FACT SHEET

The Emergency Broadband Benefit (EBB) is a temporary [program](#) to help households struggling to afford broadband internet service during the COVID-19 pandemic. The FCC program provides:

- Up to \$50/month discount for broadband service;
- Up to \$75/month discount for households on qualifying Tribal lands; and
- A one-time discount of up to \$100 for a laptop, desktop, or tablet computer purchased through a participating provider; household must contribute \$10-\$50 toward purchase price.

The EBB is limited to one monthly service discount and one device discount *per household*.

### Who is Eligible?

A household is eligible if a member of the household meets *one* of the criteria below:

- Has an income that is at or below 135% of the Federal Poverty Guidelines or participates in certain assistance programs, such as SNAP, Medicaid, or [Lifeline](#);
- Receives benefits under the free and reduced-price school lunch program or the school breakfast program, or did so in the 2019-2020 school year;
- Received a federal Pell Grant during the current award year;
- Experienced a substantial loss of income due to job loss or furlough since February 29, 2020; or
- Meets the eligibility criteria for a participating broadband provider's existing low-income or COVID-19 program.
