### Medicare Open Enrollment Period

Every year, Medicare's open enrollment period is **October 15 - December 7.**

Medicare health and drug plans can make changes each year - things like cost, coverage, and what providers and pharmacies are in their networks. October 15 to December 7 is when all people with Medicare can change their Medicare health plans and prescription drug coverage for the following year to better meet their needs. Information for next year's plans will be available beginning in October.

Two reasons make getting vaccinated against the flu the wise choice

1. It's been proven year after year that you're in better shape to fight off the flu if you get the vaccine.
2. By getting vaccinated against the flu, you help protect the people around you just like the COVID-19 vaccine. People can be infected with both flu and the virus that causes COVID-19 at the same time and have symptoms of both influenza and COVID-19.

The flu vaccine like the COVID-19 vaccine takes two weeks to build immunity after getting it. It is usually best for people to get their flu vaccine by the end of October. People can get the flu shot anytime during the flu season. The flu vaccine is your best defense against the flu, but there are additional steps you can take to help yourself from the flu and other viruses. These steps include the following:

- Wash your hands often and thoroughly with soap and water.
- Use an alcohol-based sanitizer on your hands if soap and water are not available.
- Avoid touching your eyes, nose or mouth whenever possible.
- Avoid people who are sick.
- Practice good health habits. Get plenty of sleep, exercise regularly, drink plenty of fluids and eat a healthy diets.

The best way to protect yourself and your loved ones against the flu is to get a flu vaccine every flu season. Check with your physician or your local pharmacy to get your flu vaccine.
