A few things to cover this month:

*No free table at Waite Rug There is <u>no free table</u> at Waite Rug. Please properly recycle your unwanted items or donate them elsewhere. Due to continuing concerns with Covid and bed bug transmission, among other concerns, we are not allowing items to be placed out for "free" for use by other tenants. As well-meaning as it may be intended, we must consider the potential issues it could cause. Please dispose of your unwanted items by placing them in your own garbage or take them for donation to one of the several donation centers in town. If you have large items (furniture, appliances, etc.) that you want/need to get rid of, please contact the office for your options.

*Self-treatment of bed bugs We continue to tackle the bed bug issue within the building. It is VERY IMPORTANT that YOU DO NOT self-treat your units and taking it upon yourself to treat the common areas is strictly prohibited. This creates an immunity with the bugs and actually makes the issue worse as well as the possibility that you create a health issue for another tenant and/or pet. It is against our policy for tenants to self-treat and is considered a lease violation. Please be aware that you could be liable for the expense of a Wil-Kil treatment if you are found to be self-treating your unit. Please help us eliminate this issue by cooperating with this policy as well as following the reminders of what to do if you suspect you have them in your unit. If you need a reminder of what steps to take, please contact the office.

Nurse's Notes



It was brought to our attention that medication has been found in our dumpsters. As a reminder this is not proper disposal of your medication. See below for a drug drop off locations. If it is hard for you to get to a drug drop off location just let the Housing Authority nurse know and they will get it to a drop off location for you. Their phone number is 920-424-1470 extension 124.

Proper Disposal

- It is no longer acceptable to flush or throw away medication.
- Recent studies show measurable amounts of medication have been found in drinking water and wildlife due to flushing or throwing away medications.
- Medication strength changes over time and is not typically safe after one year.
- Proper disposal removes the medication from your home in a safe way so that others don't have access to it. Use your local drug drop site.
