

I look forward to meeting with everyone this month! Please review the rest of the newsletter for more events/notices related to services in our area.



Money Management Guidance: Holiday Spending



In case the print is a bit hard to read, here is the list again:

- 1. Develop a gift-giving philosophy.

Of course, these are suggestions, not every idea here might apply to you, they are just suggestions for you to work with. One that might seem strange on this list is to donate to charity.
